


Fabric	Yardage	#of Pieces to Cut	Dimensions
Assorted dark print fabrics	2/3 yd. total	8	2 1/2" x WOF
Assorted medium & light print fabrics	3 1/8 yd. total	32	3 1/2" x WOF
Backing Fabric	3 yds.	2	50" x WOF

5 1/2" Block Piecing Diagram


Step 1 - Sew strips together. Cut into segments



Step 2 - Sew segments to strip



Step 3 - Trim to 5 1/2" blocks



each, press seams open. Sew rows together, press seams open. For backing sew 50" x WOF pieces together along 50" side, press.

Step 3

Layering pieces in the following order and placing right sides together of top and backing, sandwich top, backing and batting, pin together and trim edges even with top. Leaving 12" opening for turning, sew layers together, turn, press. Hand stitch opening closed. Quilt as desired.


Step 4

Remove tear-away backing from *Chenille By The Inch*®. Using the *Chenille Cutting Guide*™, and cutting between the stitched lines with a rotary cutter, cut into strips. Referring to photo for placement, sew

Chenille By The Inch™

Color	Amount
Chenille color of choice (Almond shown)	600"
Other Materials	
Twin-size cotton batting	
Sewing & quilting thread to match fabric	
<i>Chenille Brush</i> ™ & <i>Chenille Cutting Guide</i> ™	
Spray bottle with water

Chenille By the Inch® to seams, back tacking at beginning and end of each strip and overlapping ends of strips when joining.

Step 5

Using a spray bottle with distilled water, dampen sewn *Chenille By The Inch*®; using a *Chenille Brush*™, brush vigorously to fluff chenille.

Finished Size: 50" x 60"

This is a fun and quick scrap-type quilt. I had leftover fabrics from a fat quarter bundle, so I knew all of the fabrics would coordinate. When sewing the blocks together, randomly pick up the fabric; don't try to over think it. The randomness and the fluffy *Chenille By The Inch*® trim are what give the quilt its charm.

Note: WOF is width of fabric. Fabric measurements are based on 40" wide fabric. 1/4" seam allowance is used throughout. Pressing the seams open will allow you to sew down the *Chenille By The Inch*® easily.

Step 1

Referring to 5 1/2" Block Piecing Diagram, sew eight 2 1/2" x WOF dark strips to eight 3 1/2" x WOF light and medium strips, press seams open. Cut sewn strips into 2 1/2" segments. Sew 2 1/2" segments to remaining 3 1/2" x WOF light and medium strips, press seams open. Cut blocks apart and square to 5 1/2".

Step 2

Referring to 10 1/2" Block Assembly Diagram and turning 5 1/2" blocks so that the dark squares are side by side, assemble 10 1/2" blocks, press seams open. Assemble quilt top by sewing 6 rows of 5 blocks
